3. Do you define the targets of the interventions?		



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Crisis stage			
4. Do you define the targets of the interventions?			
5. Do you involve all the stakeholders or all the people that have knowledge of the topic? Do you clarify members' roles and establish ground rules?			
6. Do you generate a variety of alternatives, combining rational analysis with intuition, and being aware of biases?			
7. Do you implement the decision at the right time?			
Post – crisis stage			
8. If you have any doubts about your decision, do you go back and verify again your assumptions and your process?			
9. Do you critically analyse and evaluate each alternative by rating the decision criteria previously used?			
10. Do you monitor the situation and verify if there have been changes, and if other resources or different solutions are required?			

Each question is given 1 point if the answer is "YES", 0 if the answer is "NO". Total score range: from 0 to 10.
