requiring assistance from the patient
lending money to the patient
persuading people to become patients
hugging or kissing patients
treatment of a minor without parental consent
therapeutic intervention not corresponding to the patient's wishes
establishing friendly contacts with the patient (even after the end of therapy)
performing therapy with one of my friends, students, supervised or co-workers telling me that the patient has disappointed me
selling goods to patients
conducting therapy under the influence of alcohol
demanding rewards for missed meetings
discussing patients (by name or anonymous) with friends
addressing by first name
telling the patient that he is sexually attractive to us
inviting the patient to undress
refusal to communicate the diagnosis to the patient
